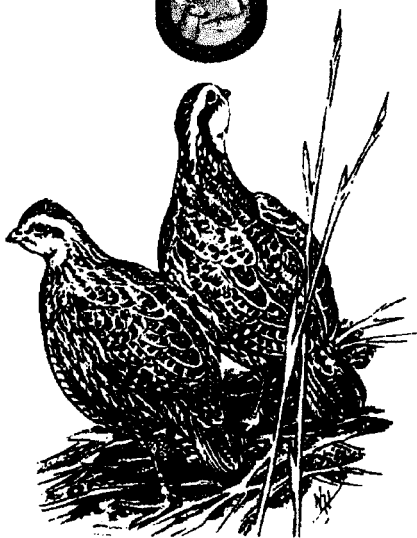

This brochure is designed to provide the public with information and a summary of regulations pertaining to hunting and other recreational use on the Baird Unit of the Richloam Wildlife Management Area. **To make it easier to learn about regulation changes on this area, regulations that are new or differ substantially from last year are shown in bold print.** For the exact wording of the wildlife laws and regulations, see Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's wildlife code on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries. This brochure and quota hunt applications should provide the information necessary for you to plan your hunting activities.

For information pertaining to hunting on private lands and trapping, consult the current Florida Hunting Handbook. This publication is available from any Commission office as well as county tax collectors and their subagents.

PERMIT, STAMP AND LICENSE INFORMATION:

Persons utilizing the wildlife management areas are required to have appropriate licenses, stamps and permits. Florida residents who are 65 years of age or older, and residents who have obtained a no-cost license through a certification of total and permanent disability by the Armed Forces or Veterans Administration or a certification of total disability by the Social Security Administration, may be exempt from most permit, stamp and license requirements on this area. Hunters under age 16 and Florida residents in the U.S. Armed Forces, not stationed in Florida and home on leave with orders in possession, are exempt from most permit, stamp and license requirements on this area.

Hunting License, Trapping License, Fishing License and Archery, Muzzleloading Gun, Wildlife Management Area, Wild Turkey and State Waterfowl permits may be purchased from county tax collectors, their subagents, Internet or by telephone.

Unless exempted, all hunters on this wildlife management area must have the following in their possession and display them upon request of any Commission employee:

1. Hunting License: Information on the categories and costs of hunting licenses is available in the Florida Hunting Handbook.
2. Wildlife Management Area Permit: This \$25 permit is required to hunt on this area.

3. Quota Hunt Permits: All hunters are required to have a quota hunt permit for this area; there are no exemptions for this area. A no-cost special quota hunt permit is required to hunt on this area during the first nine days of the archery season and during the muzzleloading gun season. There are 50 special quota hunt permits available by application for each archery and muzzleloading gun hunt. A no-cost regular quota hunt permit is required to hunt on this area during the general gun season. There are 50 regular quota hunt permits available by application for each general gun hunt. Quota permit applications are available from county tax collectors or their subagents on or about June 1. To apply for a permit, obtain a quota hunt application and follow the printed instructions.

A no-cost spring turkey quota permit is required to hunt on this area during the spring turkey hunts. There are 30 spring turkey quota hunt permits available by application for each spring turkey hunt. Spring turkey quota hunt applications are available at regional offices of the Commission

on or about December 26.

Transfer of Permits: Quota hunt and antlerless deer permits are transferable, except that any exempt permit is only transferable to another exempt person. The sale or purchase of any quota hunt permit or antlerless deer permit is prohibited.

4. Archery Permit: This \$5 permit is required when hunting during the archery hunts.

5. Muzzleloading Gun Permit: This \$5 permit is required when hunting during the muzzleloading gun hunt.

6. Wild Turkey Permit: This \$5 permit is required when hunting turkeys.

7. State Waterfowl Permit: This \$3 permit is required while hunting ducks.

8. Federal Duck Stamp: Any hunter 16 years of age or older must possess a federal duck stamp while hunting ducks. This \$15 stamp is available at post offices. Visit www.duckstamp.com for additional information regarding alternate methods and locations for purchasing of duck stamps.

9. Migratory Bird Permit: This free permit is required when hunting migratory game birds.

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS:

1. Deer--Daily limit 2, possession limit 4.

2. Wild hogs--No size or bag limit.

3. Turkey--Daily limit 1, season limit 2, possession limit 2.

4. Gray squirrel, quail and rabbit--Daily limit 12, possession limit 24 for each game species.

5. Bobcat, mink and otter--Possession limit 1 unless in possession of a Trapping License.

6. Raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk and nutria--No bag limits.

7. Migratory game birds--See Migratory Game Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

GENERAL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA REGULATIONS:

In addition to the regulations which follow, all general laws and regulations relating to wild animal life or freshwater aquatic life shall apply unless specifically excepted for this wildlife management area. Hunting or the taking of wildlife or fish on this area shall be allowed only during the open seasons and in the manner set forth herein.

1. Public access is prohibited in areas posted as "RESTRICTED" for protection of threatened or endangered species or environmentally sensitive areas.

2. No person shall cut or destroy any tree or remove any tree, shrub or protected plant (as listed in F.S. 581.185) from any wildlife management area without written permission from the landowner or primary land manager.

3. Driving a metal object into any tree or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven is prohibited.

4. It is unlawful for any person to leave any garbage or refuse or

in any way litter in the wildlife management area.

5. The wanton or willful waste of wildlife is prohibited.

6. It is unlawful to set fire to any forest, grass or woodlands or for any individual or group of individuals to build a warming fire or campfire and leave same unextinguished (Chapter 590, Florida Statutes).

7. No person shall release any wildlife on this wildlife management area.

8. It is illegal to hunt over bait or place any bait or other food for wildlife on this wildlife management area.

9. Wild hogs may not be transported alive.

10. Taking gopher tortoise is prohibited

11. Killing swimming deer is prohibited.

12. Taking fox is prohibited.

13. Taking fox squirrel is prohibited.

14. Taking any turkey while it is on the roost is prohibited.

15. Taking or attempting to take game with the aid of live decoys, traps, snares, nets, drugs, lights or recorded game calls is prohibited.

16. Hunting is prohibited in areas posted as "CLOSED."

17. Public access to the area is prohibited during the period from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.

18. The head and evidence of sex may not be removed from the carcass of any deer or turkey on the area.

19. Non-migratory game may be hunted from one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset. During spring turkey season, shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.

20. Any person hunting deer or accompanying another person hunting deer shall wear at least 500 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material above the waistline as an outer garment. This is not required when hunting during an archery-only season.

21. Deer and turkey may be dismembered in the field or camp, but each portion shall have a tag affixed to it identifying the name, address and hunting license number of the person who killed it; the date and location at which it was taken; and shall be readily traceable to the portion of the animal bearing the sex identification.

22. During periods when the area is closed to hunting, public access other than on foot (pedestrian) or bicycle is prohibited except by permit from the Division of Forestry.

23. A quota hunt permit shall be required for every hunter entering the area during the first nine days of archery, muzzleloading gun, general gun, and spring turkey hunts.

GUNS OR DOGS:

24. Hunting with gun and light is prohibited.

25. Hunting with dogs is prohibited, except that waterfowl retrievers, bird dogs, and dogs with a shoulder height of 15 inches or less, may be used during small game season. Dogs on leash may be used for trailing wounded game.

26. Fully-automatic firearms, silencer-equipped firearms, centerfire semi-automatic rifles having a magazine capable of holding more than five rounds, explosive or drug-injecting devices, or setguns are prohibited.

27. Guns are allowed only during periods in which their use for hunting is allowed.

28. No person shall have a gun in manual possession while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

29. Children under the age of 16 may not be in possession of a firearm unless in the presence of a supervising adult.

30. No person shall possess any dog when hunting with dogs is prohibited, unless the dog is a non-hunting breed and kept restrained.

31. No person shall allow any dog to pursue or molest wildlife during any period in which hunting with dogs is prohibited.

32. For hunting deer, muzzleloading guns firing a single bullet must be at least .40 caliber, those firing two or more balls must be 20 gauge or larger.

33. Possession of guns is prohibited on the James A. Van Fleet State Trail except at designated crossings. Hunters shall transport guns across the State Trail only at designated crossings.

VEHICLES:

34. Vehicles may be operated only on named or numbered roads. Bicycles may be operated only on named or numbered roads and designated firelanes.

35. Vehicles shall not be parked in such a manner as to obstruct roads, gates or firelanes.

36. The use of tracked vehicles, airboats, motorcycles, all-terrain vehicles or horses is prohibited.

37. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any part of the wildlife management area designated and posted as "CLOSED" by administrative action because of inclement weather, poor road conditions, construction, management activities or wildlife surveys.

38. Florida traffic laws relating to vehicles and operators apply on this area. The operation of an unregistered and unlicensed vehicle is prohibited. Commission off-road permits are not valid on this area.

CAMPING:

39. Camping is prohibited.

CHECK STATIONS:

40. During archery, muzzleloading gun, general gun, and spring turkey seasons, hunters shall check in at a designated check station when entering or exiting the area, and check all game taken.

41. Small game hunters shall sign in and out upon entry or exit and record their harvest at a game registration box.

42. Check station hours are 5 a.m. through 9 p.m. during Eastern Daylight Saving Time and 5 a.m. through 8 p.m. during Eastern Standard Time except during the spring turkey season when hours are 4:30 a.m. to 2 p.m.

SEARCH:

43. A wildlife officer may search any vehicle or boat when he or she reasonably believes a violation has been committed.

ARCHERY:

September 22 through October 7.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, archery permit, special quota hunt permit (if hunting during the first nine days), wild turkey permit (if hunting turkeys), state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory game birds).

Legal to Take--Any deer (except spotted fawn), turkeys of either sex, wild hogs, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, skunk, beaver, coyote, nutria and migratory game birds in season.

Regulations Unique to the Archery Hunt--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply and the possession of firearms or crossbows is prohibited.

MUZZLELOADING GUN:

October 26 through 28.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, muzzle loading gun permit, special quota hunt permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory game birds).

Legal to Take--Deer with one or more antlers at least five inches in length visible above the hairline, antlerless deer (except spotted fawn) by antlerless permit only, wild hogs, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, skunk, beaver, coyote, nutria and migratory game birds in season.

Regulation Unique to the Muzzle loading Gun Hunt--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply and only muzzle loading guns are allowed.

GENERAL GUN:

November 10 through 13 and 14 through 18.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, regular quota hunt permit, state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory game birds).

Legal to Take--Deer with one or more antlers at least five inches in length visible above the hairline, antlerless deer (except spotted fawn) by antlerless permit only, wild hogs, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, skunk, beaver, coyote, nutria and migratory game birds in season.

Regulations Unique to the General Gun Hunt--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

SMALL GAME:

December 1 through 16 and January 19 through February 10.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory game birds).

Legal to Take--Gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum,

armadillo, skunk, beaver, coyote, nutria, migratory game birds in season, bobcat, mink and otter.

Regulations Unique to the Small Game Hunt--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply and the possession of centerfire rifles is prohibited.

SPRING TURKEY:

March 16 through 18, 22 through 24, and March 29 through 31.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, spring turkey quota hunt permit and wild turkey permit.

Legal to Take--Bearded turkeys or gobblers.

Regulations Unique to the Spring Turkey Hunt--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations shall apply.

TRAPPING:

Trapping is prohibited.

MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS:

Rails, common moorhens, mourning doves, white-winged doves, snipe, ducks, coots, woodcock and crows may be hunted during seasons established by the Commission for these species which coincide with the established hunting seasons.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Hunting license, wildlife management area permit, state waterfowl permit and federal waterfowl stamp (if hunting ducks), a quota hunt permit (if hunting during quota periods), migratory bird permit.

Legal to Take--See Migratory Game Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

Regulations Unique to Migratory Game Birds--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations and Migratory Game Bird Hunting Regulations shall apply and the use of lead shot for taking ducks and coots is prohibited.

FISHING AND FROGGING:

Permitted throughout the year.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements--Fishing license (not required when frogging).

Regulations Unique to Fishing and Frogging--All General Wildlife Management Area Regulations and statewide fishing regulations shall apply, and the possession of guns is permitted only during periods when hunting is allowed.

DIVISION OF FORESTRY REGULATIONS:

1. A valid fuel wood permit from the Division of Forestry is required before fire wood may be removed from the area.

2. Construction of permanent or semipermanent structures on state forests is prohibited.

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS AND STATE FORESTS ARE NOT JUST FOR HUNTING AND FISHING!

They have been purchased for preservation to benefit all of Florida's residents and you don't have to hunt or fish to enjoy them! The same habitat management practices that provide hunting and fishing opportunities also create opportunities for wildlife viewing. These areas provide a range of opportunities, from scenic driving routes to rugged hiking adventures. See the natural Florida that we have protected through acquisition and careful management.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. Florida Statute 267.13 prohibits digging in or otherwise defacing Indian mounds, collecting artifacts or disturbing archaeological and historic sites on state-owned lands.

2. Defacing, molesting or destroying signs or other property on or about this management area is punishable by law.

3. Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 must have passed a Commission-approved hunter safety course prior to being issued a hunting license.

5. Division of Forestry management plans include prescribed burning most months of the year. For personal safety reasons, area users should contact the Division of Forestry for information and location of burn areas, (352) 754-6896.

COOPERATION REQUESTED:

Please do not discharge firearms at anything other than legal game while in a wildlife management area. Target practice and random discharge of firearms have become increasing threats to the quality of the hunting experience.

Since you have the privilege to use this wildlife management area, go the extra mile to exercise great caution and care while hunting, fishing, sightseeing or using the area in any way--leave the area better than you found it. Hunters, wildlife, the environment and conservation in general can only benefit.

Your conduct on this area may determine your future use of the area. PLEASE DO NOT LITTER. TAKE TRASH OUT WITH YOU.

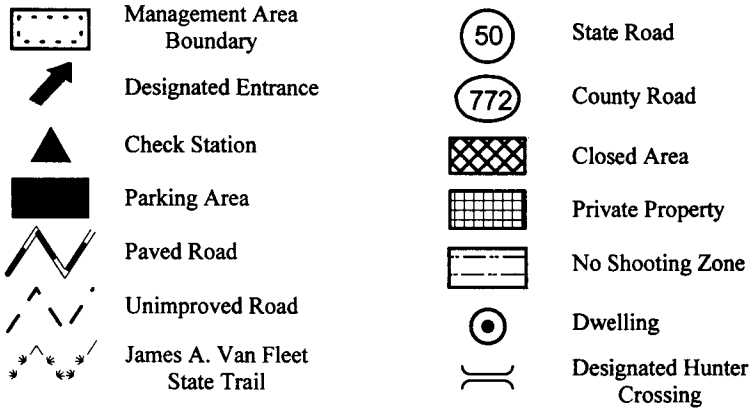
